To Our Church Members and Friends,

I wanted to share a few insights to what happened between the Old Testament and the New Testament. David Jeremiah reminds us that during that 400 years from Malachi to the birth of Jesus Christ many things happened. This period of time is called the silent years or the Intertestamental Period. During the Babylonian exile the Jews begin to use the Aramaic language, which has a lot of similarities to the Hebrew language. Alexander the Great defeated the Persians during this time and he freed a number of the Greek cities from the Persian rule, and once again they were now governed under Greek rule. The Greek language and culture once again was free to spread all throughout the region. The New Testament was on the horizon as Jesus was born and it would be recorded in the Koine Greek or common man's language.

One of the problems that was present when Jesus was born was that the Roman Empire was continuing to grow and flourish, eventually claiming Judea and Jerusalem. Roman governors were appointed and Pontius Pilate was one of them, who would issue the order to crucify Jesus. The Jews longed for the Messiah who was prophesied to come and to deliver them from the oppression that they were under. Jesus came, but he did not come in a manner that they had desired. He was not to be a political king or one who would overthrow the existing government. Yet, Jesus would have an impact that would change the world forever.

Charles Spurgeon wrote this "There are times when solitude is better than society, and silence is wiser than speech. We should be better Christians if we were more alone, waiting upon God, and gathering through meditation on His Word spiritual strength for labour in His Service. We ought to muse upon the things of God, because we thus get the real nutriment out of them."

This silent period must have seemed all too long, but God was and is still in control!! Many say today, I long for the return of Jesus, and I along with others long for that day. Will it be today? Tomorrow? We do not know the hour or time but just as it was between the O.T. and N.T. God had not left His throne and His hand remains on the hearts and lives of His people. On this day, God is still at work in the lives of His creations, so in this world there are and will continue to be trials and tribulations, but be brave for God's hand and power and grace are and will never cease to be with us. Do Not Fear!! His love and hand is present.

Do Not Dismay for He is with us and has never left us!!


Daylight Savings Time ends on November 7th.
